Last year God's Pantry Food Bank distributed 22.9 million pounds of food – more food than ever before – enough food to make 17.6 million meals! We identified underserved counties and communities and introduced targeted initiatives in response. We leveraged new and existing partnerships to remain one of the most efficient nonprofit organizations in Kentucky, devoting less than four percent of our annual budget to administrative costs. Whether it was a successful initiative, program or partnership, we came together to provide healthy food for men, women and children in Central and Eastern Kentucky.

This year's annual report includes lots of numbers and statistics. It also includes stories and letters from Kentuckians who have been nourished by the food distributed. The people we meet through the work we do keeps the staff highly motivated and focused on continually improving our food collection and distribution models.

Tough economic conditions have affected us all. With high unemployment and new faces of hunger emerging every day, we've seen an unprecedented need. But with your support we are moving through this recession even stronger than when we started. Thanks to your support we were able to surpass our distribution goal by more than 1.4 million meals! When I think about the thousands of families and individuals who had food on the table because of those meals, I am truly overwhelmed.

Changing Our Operations to Meet the Need

Last year was a time of great growth for our Food Bank and the challenges we faced in feeding record numbers of people forced us to think outside the box.

We needed to find a way to provide food to an ever-increasing number of families living on the margins in our service area, but we had to do so in an economy which forced many food and product donors to “tighten their belts,” resulting in less donations.



Yet, we managed to distribute 28 percent more food this past year than in 2010. How, you ask?

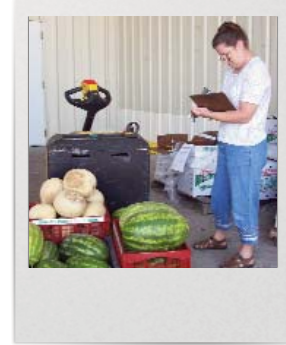
Well, we “thought outside the box,” – literally! We began repacking bulk food product into family friendly sizes in the confines of our clean room, accessing products ranging from 2,000-pound bags of rice to 50-pound bags of pinto beans.

We then utilized more volunteers than ever in our history to put this product into smaller size

packaging for families in need.

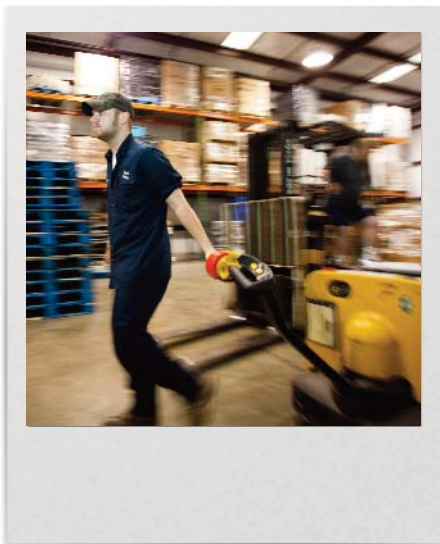
Another initiative which helped us keep pace with record demand was doubling, yes doubling, our produce distribution – from 3 million pounds in 2010 to more than 6 million pounds last year.

Produce is not only a healthy and nutritious option for our clients, it’s also food that is readily available in this country. It’s estimated that 20 percent of crops grown in this country each year are left in the fields to rot.



While expensive for the Food Bank to transport and store, produce is always given out at no charge to our agencies.

“Produce is expensive and we simply can’t afford to use our dollars to buy these foods,” said Peggy Hancock with Grateful Bread Food Pantry in Mt. Vernon. “We can’t thank God’s Pantry enough for the tremendous donations they’ve given us this summer.”

Our Programs & Services

Fayette County Emergency Food Program



The Fayette County Emergency Food Program has been at the core of God's Pantry's mission since our organization was founded by Mim Hunt in 1955.

While this work has been at the heart of our operations for a half-century, the need continues to grow. Last year, we served an average of 1,650 client families each month and as we closed the books on FY 2011, even more families were requesting our help.

Our partner organizations and volunteers have allowed us to continue meeting the needs of this community through their generosity. When demand has climbed, our pantries have expanded their hours and volunteers have worked to serve more families in each session.

In FY 2011, more than 19,765 families were served by the Emergency Food Box Program in Fayette County.

Food for the Counties

God's Pantry Food Bank works hard to make sure that each of the 50 counties in our service area are equipped to meet the challenges of feeding hungry families in their communities.

When we sense an area is "underserved" we tackle the problem head-on. Our first approach is to work with existing partner programs to increase capacity and feed more families.

Our agency services team also spends time working with community leaders to identify obstacles

affecting food distribution and to identify potential partners. While we work to resolve problems and establish relationships, we often do direct delivery of food to these areas through a program called *Food for the Counties*.

Food for the Counties sends a truckload of food into a community for a direct delivery to clients at a designated time and location. We continue to provide this program until we believe the needs are being met in a particular area.

Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)

CSFP is a great help to us. We only get just a few food stamps. We get more in the commodity box than we get with the food stamps. We sure do appreciate this food program.

Our Programs & Services

The Backpack Program



Growing up and attending school, I'm sure we all had some favorite and some not-so-favorite items on the school lunch menu. We all looked forward to Friday Pizza Days, right?

Well, for many school-aged children living in poverty, that Friday pizza lunch is sadly the last reliable meal that child will eat until breakfast is served at school on Monday morning.

The Backpack Program was designed to help these children by sending them home on weekends and holiday breaks with some ready-to-eat snacks and meals.

God's Pantry Food Bank started its Backpack efforts in 2002 through an existing Kids Cafe location and is continuing to grow the program as funding allows.

In FY 2011, the Food Bank distributed more than 15,700 Backpacks through 12 sites and helped provide food to another 16 programs throughout the 50-county service area.

Kids Cafe



In our work, we are faced with many sad realities. One of the most difficult is knowing that 1 in 4 Kentucky children is at risk of hunger. Enough children go to bed hungry in our service area each

night to fill Rupp Arena more than four times. Simply shocking.

The Food Bank is working hard to target childhood hunger through our member pantries, shelters and kitchens but also through special kid-focused programming.

God's Pantry opened its first Kids Cafe in 1999, providing at-risk children with a safe place to go after school, receive help with their homework and a hot meal before they leave. For many children, the Kids Cafe makes the difference between going

to bed hungry or not.

God's Pantry Food Bank had eight Kids Cafe sites last year which served 23,740 meals.

I'm a language arts teacher at a middle school here in Lexington. Each of my kids keeps a daily journal and I review them periodically. Most kids write about sports or weekend plans, but one student's journal made me rethink what I'm thankful for.

When I read her journal, I discovered that she had written the last two days about not having anything to eat at home. I wanted to cry, but I knew I had to do something about this. I called God's Pantry and found out how to get her family a food box and they told me about Kids Cafe. I don't know if this helped her, but I hope it did.

I support God's Pantry because it's helping in more ways than I'll ever know.

2011 Snapshots

The Food Bank distributed **22.9 million pounds of food** to more than 211,000 people in need in 50 Central & Eastern Kentucky counties.



Of the nearly 23 million pounds distributed in 2011, **6.1 million pounds was fresh produce**, doubling the distribution total from 2010.

Our 275 member agencies were instrumental in helping us distribute **29 percent more food** this year than last.



Our five Fayette County emergency food pantries served an average of **1,650 client families** monthly.

More than **6,000 people** donated a record **25,000 hours** of their time to our organization through our pantries, office and warehouse.

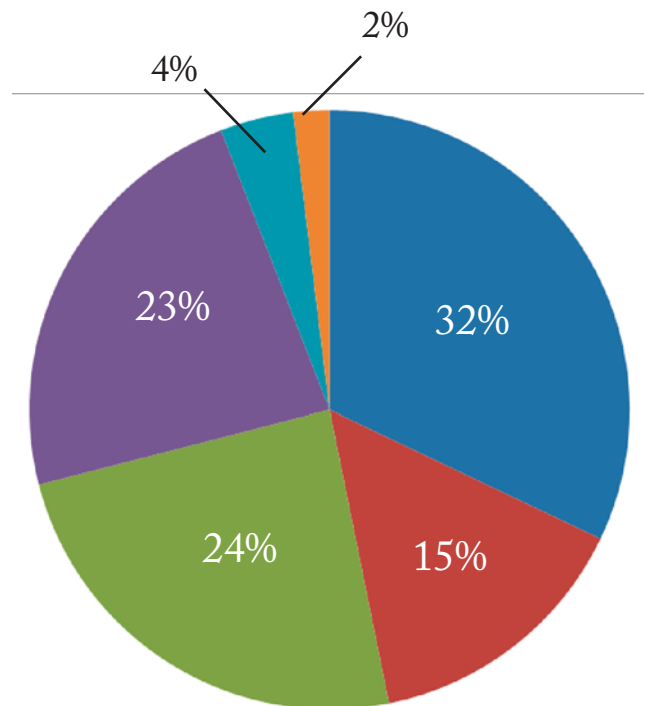

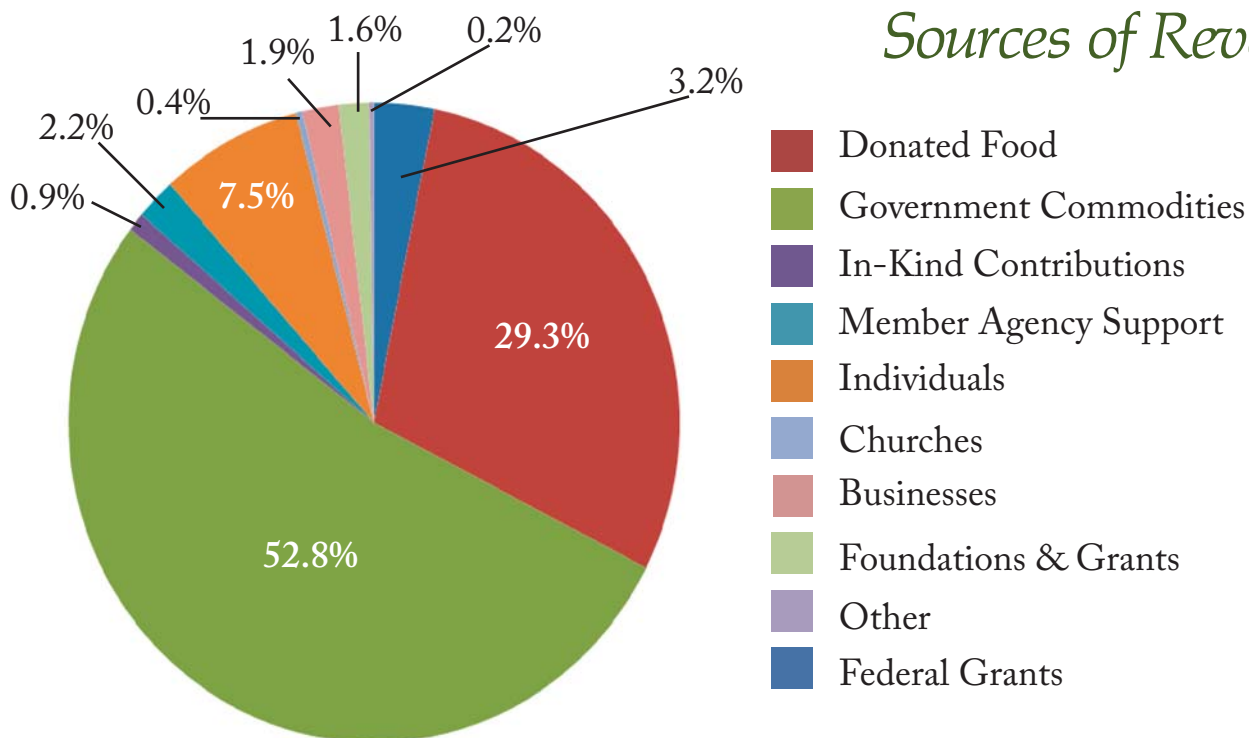

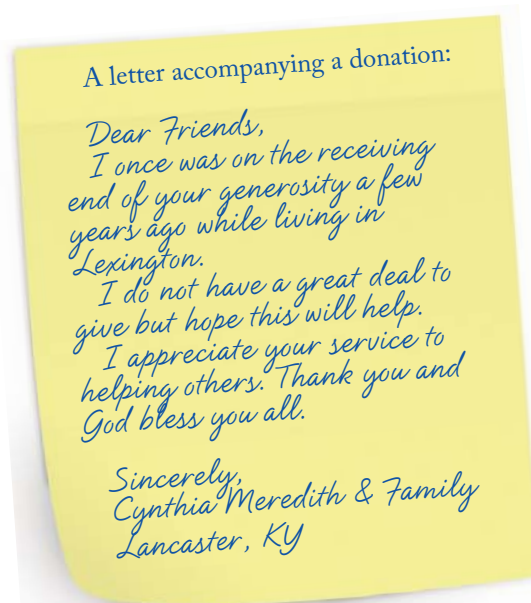
